Students come primarily from Montgomery County (MD) though we do have students from surrounding counties, as well as the District of Columbia and Northern Virginia. Approximately 32% of our students identify themselves as being from an underrepresented population.

AHC is a member of the National Association for College Admission Counseling (NACAC) and complies with the NACAC Statement of Principles of Good Practice.

### AHC Statement on Reporting Withdrawals and Disciplinary Actions to Colleges and Universities

All college applications ask the student and the counselor whether the applicant has ever been suspended. It is our school policy that we do not report any disciplinary actions to colleges and universities, however all students are expected to be truthful throughout their applications and must indicate whether an issue has arisen. If a student responds in the affirmative to this question, she must share a copy of her written explanation with her college counselor. If a student leaves the Academy, she will be given a one-week period to inform all colleges and universities to which she has applied. At the end of the time period, the college counseling office will notify colleges and universities of the student's departure.

# ACADEMIC PROFILE 2013-2014

### Academics & Grading

The Academy is committed to providing for individual needs and differences in learning styles. Faculty involvement with students extends beyond the classroom into co-curricular activities. Our school year is divided into two semesters and classes are taught on a block schedule. Semester exams are worth 20% of the final grade and are given prior to the Christmas break and at the end of the academic year.

Holy Cross was authorized by the International Baccalaureate Organization in November 2009; our first Diploma Programme candidates graduated in June 2012.

Due to the relatively small size and strong quality of our graduates, the Academy does not rank. Grades shown on our transcripts reflect a .5 additional weight for Honors level courses and an additional .7 weight for Advanced Placement and/or International Baccalaureate level courses.

### **Graduation Requirements**



# TESTING

Advanced Placement: From 2011-2013, 234 students sat for 659 AP exams. 73% of the students earned a score of 3 or above.

*International Baccalaureate:* Our first International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme candidates graduated in June 2012. In 2013, all seven candidates received diplomas. In 2013, 78 students sat for 139 exams and 77% of the students earned a score of 4 or above.
