
- College preparatory curriculum that focuses on critical thinking, academic & analytical writing, and personal reflection

- A variety of senior electives that fit our students' myriad interests and desired strength of schedule




Pathway to Graduation

Dual Credit Opportunity

Seniors are eligible to take Dual Credit Microeconomics from Marymount University (held on our campus) in the fall of their senior year. The dual credit program allows students to earn ½ credit from the History Department towards her graduation requirement plus 3 undergraduate credit hours from Marymount University.
